


Grasslands Enhancement Pilot Project

- **Provides Grazing Incentives on Leased State School Trust and Public Land**

Do you have a need for water, fencing and power on leased State School Trust and public land? The Grasslands Enhancement Pilot Project (GEPP), funded through North Dakota’s Outdoor Heritage Fund, may be the opportunity you have been looking for. Ducks Unlimited and the North Dakota Natural Resources Trust have partnered to provide grazing incentives for lessees of State School Trust and public land in the Bakken oil field (North of the Missouri River).

Across the Bakken, lessees of State School Trust and public land have a need for quality water, cross fencing, and power to allow for rotational grazing practices. GEPP will provide cost-share to implement rotational grazing infrastructure. This opportunity will make it more cost effective to transition to rotational grazing and better utilize leased land. The objective of the program is to provide lessees with the resources to improve rangeland health, plant diversity, drought tolerance and water quality.
